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ABSTRACT

In Southeast Asian countries, particularly Indonesia, the implementation of international teaching practicum had gained popularity alongside numerous university-based English. This program offered students opportunities for international experiences and aimed to prepare them professionally before entering the teaching profession. This research focused on two university students as pre-service teacher who chose international teaching practicum in Malaysia and Thailand than local practicum in Indonesia. The aim of the research was to know the experiences of international teaching practicum (ITP) students as pre-service teachers especially the challenges and strategies during teaching English in Malaysia and Thailand. The research method used in this research was qualitative research that used narrative inquiry as the approach. The data collection used interview for many times that interviewed one of UNISMA's student who was participating international teaching practicum in Malaysia and one of UNARS's student who was participating international teaching practicum in Thailand. And the data was analyzed by using thematic analysis. The research findings showed that international teaching practicum implementation created new experience that faced both of pre-service teachers to the cultural and academic challenges which forced them to find the strategies such as adaptation, mentor's role, and pre-service teachers' professional development to overcome the challenges.


